Writing

The thing I love most about this book is the WORD CHOICE. There are so many carefully selected words and phrases. Similes abound, as do examples of the good old 'show don't tell' strategy for writing (eg. "Mum was in the kitchen, rattling plates" i.e she was doing the dishes).

Another writing focus for this book would be the use of lists of three items (eg. "Tiny slept, my mother drank cups of tea, and I hate homemade biscuits with homemade jam squished in the middle.") At the end of this book Phil Cummings has included information (in the form of a newspaper report) where he tells the reader about his real-life experience on the day.

This would be a great text to use a mentor text for recount writing to dispel the myth that recounts are boring.

Reading

For reading, I would discuss summarising key information and discuss the cross over to recount writingwhich parts of your recount are the most important? INFERRING discussions could come from many of the lovely descriptions in this book.
