It is has been written by the students at One Arm Point Remote Community School and not only does the book highlight the culture and lifestyles of indigenous children from North Western Australia, it includes several great examples of different text types along the way. There are recounts, diagrams, information reports, procedures and even traditional narratives. This would be a useful text to pull out again and again with a different focus each time.

I would especially recommend using this book to look at procedural writing with students as there are a number of different examples ranging from 'how to' texts on making men's spears or dressing snake bites through to recipes for cooking oyster pancakes. (ORGANISATION)

You could also explore the use of precise and technical vocabulary throughout the book (WORD CHOICE) or look at the many different writing focuses and genres students have come up with from the topic of 'Our World.'
